



2/14 Alamayah, Indonesia

It's only a 50-minute flight from Bali, but Sumba feels like a different universe. Home to one of the last flourishing prehistoric tribes on earth, Sumba's rich culture and raw natural beauty make it a true gem; it also hosts only a handful of responsible hotels committed to preserving this special community. The newest name is Alamayah, a five-star boutique retreat located in the beachside village of Kerewe.

Getting here is an adventure in itself—guests take a two-hour drive through mountains, waterfalls and mahogany forests that introduce the island's untouched scenery. With only six private suites, the intimate hotel is focused on helping guests reconnect with themselves, offering activities such as yoga, sound healing, jungle treks and, of course, surfing. The all-inclusive stay also features a healer's body analysis, three plant-based meals a day, as well as medicinal mixology.




3/14 Ariara, The Philippines

Ariara is all about low-impact luxury—promising guests a glimpse of the Philippines as it was before tourism descended on the islands. 
4/14 Bawah Reserve, Indonesia

Just a three-hour journey from Singapore is Bawah Reserve—one of Indonesia's most exclusive, off-the-grid resorts. Set amidst the Anambas archipelago, Bawah is a sanctuary for mindful travellers. It is the first island in Indonesia to be powered by a renewable micro-grid, boasting 35 safari tent-like villas hand-built from sustainable materials such as bamboo, recycled teak and copper. The property hosts up to 70 guests at any time, though we imagine further restrictions will be implemented once it is re-opened. Bawah Reserve will also be unveiling Elang Private Island this year, an adults-only private island experience featuring six ecoconsicous cliffside lodges created by Singaporean design Sim Boon Yang.

With the surrounding beauty of flourishing greenery and tranquil blue waters, entertainment here comes in the form of the great outdoors—there is no TV or radio in the suite, and Wifi connectivity is limited. Instead, the resort offers the sandy beach at your doorstep with a myriad of water sports options, a well-appointed open-air spa, and other activities like yoga and trekking.




6/14 Brother Island, The Philippines




9/14 Nihi Sumba, Indonesia


10/14 Nikoi Private Island, Indonesia




11/14 NoaNoa Island, The Philippines






12/14 Song Saa Private Island, Cambodia


